

Evangelism Definitions

 **TAKE ONE**

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REPENTANCE: Change of one's mind to respect God for who He is and obey Him. It implies forsaking behavior that God calls evil (wickedness) and embracing that which He calls good (righteousness). It is thus coming to an agreement with Him about what sin is and turning away from it. It is man's response to God's love demonstrated in the sacrifice of Jesus the Messiah (John 3:16) and is the motion of a contrite heart that is broken about past self-willed rebellion towards God. It is required for the forgiveness of sins (Acts 2:38; Acts 3:19) and the receiving of God's gift of eternal life.

SIN: Transgression of God's law (1 John 3:4). It is going our own ways and disregarding God and his ways; it is disobeying God, not loving Him, rebelling against Him. Sin brings separation between God and man (Isaiah 59:2), and ultimately utter destruction, while the alternative to that is what the preaching of the Gospel is about: salvation through faith in Jesus the Messiah, which entails being reconciled to God, receiving his gift of eternal life and coming to have fellowship and an intimate spiritual relationship with Him.

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FAITH: Faithfulness to obey God's commandments, which produces righteousness (1 John 3:7; Romans 6:16). Having faith towards God or faith in Jesus is being faithful to practice the teachings of Jesus and so be his disciple who trusts, loves and follows Him (Luke 9:23; John 14:15-21) as the only way to the Father (John 14:6). He came into the world to set an example of life centered on loving God, that is, being obedient to Him, and loving others as oneself, that is, treating them like one would want to be treated (Matthew 7:12).

BEING BORN AGAIN: It is the response of God (Yahweh) to those who repent. They are given a new life in which they are free to serve God (do his will) rather than to be in bondage to sin. It is an act of God's will (John 1:13; 3:6-7) and the result of having received the Holy Spirit of God (Acts 5:32; Ephesians 1:13), a token of the gift of eternal life promised in the Gospel (Romans 6:23). The way of operation of that is through the living word of God from the bible that is heard and believed and so is acted upon (John 8:31-36).

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
