

Evangelism Definitions

REPENTANCE: Change of one's mind to respect God for who He is and obey Him. It implies being inclined to seek God's will and to do it: forsaking behavior that God calls evil (wickedness) and embracing that which He calls good (righteousness). It is thus coming to an agreement with Him about what sin is and turning away from it (2 Timothy 2:19). Repentance is man's response to God's love demonstrated in the sacrifice of Jesus the Messiah (John 3:16). It is required for the forgiveness of sins (Acts 2:38; Acts 3:19) and the receiving of God's gift of eternal life.

SIN: Transgression of God's law (1 John 3:4). It is going our own ways and disregarding God and his ways; it is disobeying God, not loving Him, rebelling against Him. Sin brings separation between God and man (Isaiah 59:2), and ultimately utter destruction, while the alternative to that is what the preaching of the Gospel is about: salvation through faith in Jesus the Messiah. That entails being reconciled to God, receiving his gift of eternal life and coming to have fellowship and an intimate spiritual relationship with Him.

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BEING BORN AGAIN: It is the response of God (Yahweh) to those who repent. They are given a new life in which they are free serve God (do his will). It is an act of God's will (John 1:13; 3:6-7) and a supernatural experience for the believer – not something a person can make happen with resolutions or by following a ritual in a religious setting. It is also the evidence of having received the Holy Spirit of God (Acts 5:32) and the gift of eternal life through Jesus Christ (Romans 6:23) as promised in the Gospel. The way of operation of that is through the living word of God from the bible that is heard and believed and so is acted upon (John 8:31-36).

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
