Dear Reader:

Since the writing of my book, God has continued to lead me in my walk of faith and to open my eyes more on various matters. While it is my prayer that your faith be strengthened through this reading, I want to draw your attention on the following passages of my book in particular:

* On page 43, I gave a nod to Santa Claus, but I have learned a lot since then on the origins of Christmas that would have me hold a different position today on the innocence of mingling with Santa Claus or entertaining the myths associated with Christmas. So I invite you to do your research on that tradition, as well as on Easter also which I mentioned (p 37), and may your conviction of the truth guide your action.

* On page 45, likewise, I advocated for Christian activism. But as I grew in my understanding of separation from the world (1 John 2:15-17; John 15:19), I no longer hold to such view as what a Christian is called to be involved in while a stranger in this world. There is a nuance to be made between taking a stand for righteousness and being a light in this world as called to be by Christ, pointing souls to the way of eternal life, and trying to change the world. I invite you to prayerfully consider your calling in this world, so that all aspects of your conduct may be submitted to the will of God.

* On page 29, lastly, I will note to your attention that I am not one drawn to the debates about what is to be called "Trinity." But God the Father is one Lord. He has made Himself known in the flesh through his Son Jesus Christ who has walked on the earth and promised his Holy Spirit to those who obey Him (Acts 2:38; 5:32). Jesus is in the Father and the Father is in Him (John 14:11).

I have noted here the points on which my understanding has grown and deviated the most from the time when I wrote this book. Ultimately, a Christian wants to answer this question about everything, every dear belief or value: Does it glorify God? I urge you to follow no man but to go on asking, seeking and knocking at the door for more truth and understanding and wisdom from God.
